### **SECONDARY SCHOOL SEMESTER EXAMS**

In the coming weeks our secondary students (years 7 to 11) will commence their semester 1 exams. Perhaps the most important aspect of exams is to understand why students sit exams. Learning is a continual cycle; we measure students abilities, set learning goals, participate in learning activities and then assess the students' progress against the goals that were set. Alongside other assessment activities such as projects, classroom activities and assignments, exams are just one means for learning goals to be assessed. It is important for learning to be continually assessed as it:

- Allows students to realise the progress they are making and build self-efficacy as they master new skills/concepts
- Provides insight for students to understand their strengths - important as they start to make decisions about their future and careers
- Provides important feedback to teachers regarding the strength and opportunities of our students and the effectiveness of our teaching approach to date. This feedback allows teachers to modify their lessons to enhance student future learning
- Allows parents to understand how their child is performing when assessed against the expectations of the curriculum

Included in the following pages is a copy of the campus exam timetable as well as some hints and tips for students and how you can support them

- Get students organized early for exam preparation. The sooner students commence exam preparations, the more time they will have. Decide on time allocation and make a plan to study
- Gather all relevant materials, make study notes and practice
- Study harder subjects first
- Take short breaks during study sessions
- Avoid distractions of electronic gadgets. It is best to study in a quiet area at home
- Seek help from teachers if your child does not understand any aspect of their work

Parents, it is worth reminding that the best of the plans can fail if they are not implemented. Please assist your child(ren) by helping them follow a study plan.

### **LOOKING AHEAD – TERM THREE**

Term three will see plenty of opportunities for each of our student to immerse themselves in activities both within and outside the school. Experiences such as excursions and incursions provide interactive learning experiences and often facilitate broader life skill development.
